#### School and community

Eaglesvale Senior School is a Christian, coeducational, boarding and day school that seeks to develop the potential of each student. Eaglesvale brings together 13 – 19 year old students of different abilities and nurtures the academic, sporting and cultural abilities of these students through a 6-7 year educational programme.

The Dutch Reformed church established Daisyfield School and Orphanage in Bulawayo in 1911. Daisyfield later was relocated to its present site in Harare in 1948 under the name Bothashoff. In 1986 the name Eaglesvale was adopted. The institution turns 117 in 2018 and is one of the oldest independent schools in Zimbabwe.

Eaglesvale senior school current enrolment is 397 with a 25:1 pupil teacher ratio per class. The school caters for students of every academic level including students with special educational needs. Eaglesvale takes pride in the Monday morning assemblies where we invite prominent personalities who impart life skills to students and teachers.

## Academics

The school follows the Cambridge international examinations for all students. Students write 'O' level (IGCSE) after four or five years at about 16-17 years of age. The students can proceed to 'A' level where they can do three subjects with AS English language being offered to every 'A' level student

English is the language of instruction and French is offered as a foreign language to all form one and two student and is optional at 'O' and 'A' level. Practical subjects include design and technology, fashion and textiles and art and design.

#### Leadership

Eaglesvale Senior School promotes servant leadership based on Jesus Christ's example. Students are taught leadership skills from form one level where they can become a class monitor or a team captain at their level. Guidance lessons are offered from Form one through to Upper six level. At Lower six the students attend a seven day leadership training camp at Outward Bound Zimbabwe where they are exposed to strong leadership skills and team dynamics.

Senior leaders are then appointed by the Headmaster and his staff with one Head boy and his deputy and one Head girl and her deputy plus a team of prefects. The rest of the upper six students have opportunity to serve as captains or leaders of the different sports and clubs offered at the school.
